(Mashpee, October 13, 2015) Seventeen local high school students with adventurous spirits and a desire to serve the poor will spend their April school vacation week together on a special mission trip to one of the poorest parts of the country.

The students, all Youth Ministry members from the Parish of Christ the King in Mashpee, will spend the week of April 17-23, 2016 in Wheeling, West Virginia, a region of Appalachia characterized by extreme poverty. They will take part in a number of activities and projects, ranging from light construction, painting, cooking and gardening to serving meals and operating a thrift shop. They'll be joined on the trip by several adult chaperones, led by mission coordinators David and Cheryl Ryan of Cotuit.

"Our group is following the call of Pope Francis in service to the poor," said Cheryl Ryan. "We are blessed to have this wonderful opportunity to help some of the poorest people in our nation."

The group will begin the 12-hour car trip to Appalachia early on the morning of Sunday, April 17, driving in two large vans. "The mission is a tremendous experience," said Nathan Ryan, a Barnstable High School senior who went on the last mission trip two years ago. "We see first-hand how difficult day-to-day living is for many people in our own country. It is a privilege and a blessing to help them."
